Stop and Account

- Require a person in a public place to account
- Actions
- Behaviour
- Presence
- Possession of anything
- Recommendation 61 Macpherson Report
- Flanagan report



Reasonable Grounds – PACE Code A

- Officer must have reasonable grounds to search
- Stolen property
- Prohibited articles
- Drugs
- Firearms



Terrorism Act 2000 – s44

- Authority granted by Chief Officer
- Ratified by Government Minister
- Expedient to prevent acts of terrorism
- Geographical Area
- Time Period
- Officer does not require reasonable grounds
- Vehicles or persons in the vehicle
- Pedestrians or anything carried by them



Public Order – s60 CJPOA 1994

- Authority granted by Superintendent / Inspector
- Serious violence may take place
- Persons carrying dangerous or offensive weapons
- Officer does not require reasonable grounds
- Geographical Area
- Time Period

Analysis

- Overall encounters decreased by 30% 110,013
- Terrorism Act searched reduced by 70% 17,050
- Reasonable Grounds stops down by 8% 26,844
- Public Order use declined by 35% 6,245





Gillan & Quinton v United Kingdom

- Unduly wide discretion on police
- Insufficient remedies if used incorrectly
- Rejected by House of Lords

- European Court Of Human Rights
- Insufficient safeguards in domestic law
- Contrary to Right of Privacy (Article 8)
