

Dwyer unveils his police and crime plan

THE first Police and Crime Plan by Cheshire's Police Commissioner has been released this week.

In the run-up to the election last November, John Dwyer – along with the other candidates – made manifesto commitments to the public.

Since being elected into office, John has been working to deliver the promises he made to the people of Cheshire during the election campaign.

Since taking up office, Mr Dwyer has consulted the public, partner agencies and the chief constable.

The feedback he received helped him to write the Police and Crime Plan.

The draft was considered by the Police and Crime Panel, which supported the objectives the Commissioner was keen to focus on.

Mr Dwyer said: "Since being elected, I've held various roadshows and surgeries across the county to establish what the public of Cheshire want from their police service.

"By using this information I have developed my first Police and Crime Plan."

A leaflet will be posted through residents' doors across the county, so they know exactly what the Commissioner's plans for the next three years are.

He said: "The people who live in Cheshire will be able to hold me to account based on the objectives that I've outlined in my Police and Crime Plan.

"In turn, I will hold the Chief Constable to account.

"I encourage the people of Cheshire to let me know if they think something isn't right and I'll do what I can to try and find a solution."
