There were 125 million journeys on the London Overground, a rise of 22 per cent on the previous year; and 100m passenger journeys on the DLR, a year-on-year rise of 16.2 per cent.

London Assembly transport committee chair Caroline Pidgeon said: "Slowly but surely some real changes are taking place on parts of the Tube after so many decades of neglect and underinvestment.

"The challenge is not to be complacent but instead to ensure capacity and reliability continue to improve for many more years to come. This is absolutely essential for a capital city that is growing and where severe overcrowding is still a daily reality for too many Tube passengers.'

Mayor Boris Johnson said: "It has been another stonking year for London and the Tube network which has enabled the capital to showcase itself to the world. With London due to grow by a city the size of Birmingham over the next decade it is imperative that we continue to see the sustained investment in our transport

Tube managing director Mike Brown said that his bid to take over rail services on commuter lines remained on track despite a shake-up of the franchising process in the wake of the West Coast mainline fiasco.

He is targeting the London section of lines currently operated by Southeastern and
