Drivers for change



- Last year set out strategic objectives to deliver '20:20:10' & value for mone
- Gave you a commitment to use the policing plans to;
 - Ensure that all resources that contribute to railway safety are tasked to maximise effectiveness though a joined-up process
 - Effectively engage with railway service providers so that their priorities and concerns are built into BTP's strategic planning processes
 - Engage with rail staff and the travelling public and ensure that their concerns and priorities effectively influence BTP planning processes
- Address your continued requests for a more local focus
- Used BTP's new operating model to build stronger local relationships

- This year? Building on last year's success we propose to...
- Retain two-tiers of targets
 - Sub-divisional
 - National
- Use a bottom-up approach to identify your priorities that will;
 - Be led by your local ACC and Divisional Commander
 - Explore what contribution could/should each division and sub-division make to achieving the strategic objectives
 - Identify areas/themes should be the priority locally to deliver '20:20:10'?
 - Capture any PSA holder specific requests for review

- Develop partnership working look for opportunities for joint targets
- Demonstrate stronger links between plans and resources
