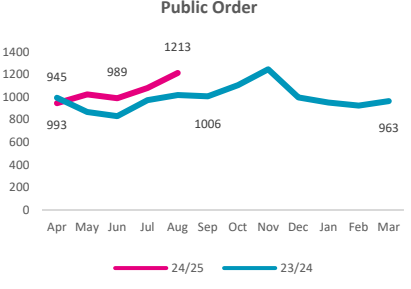

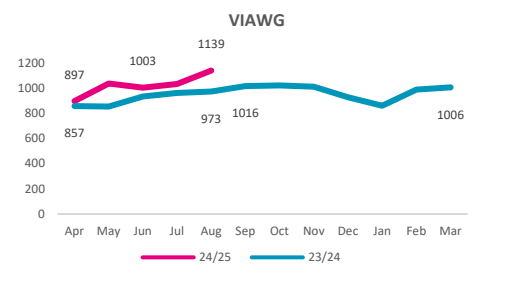

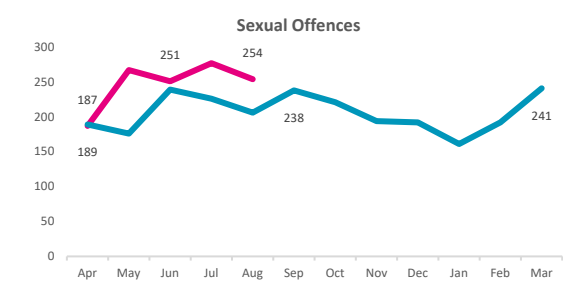

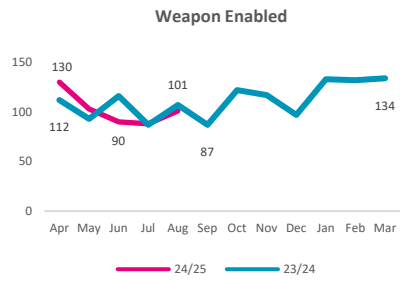

VIAWG is on the rise after a drop in May. It has increased 27% since the start of FY.



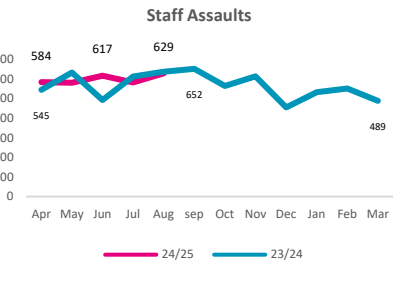

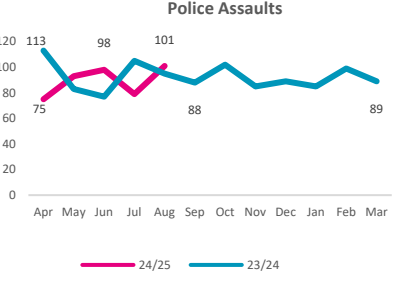

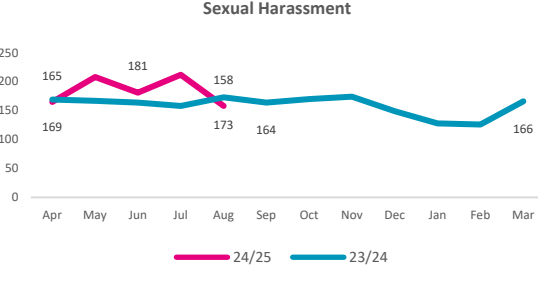

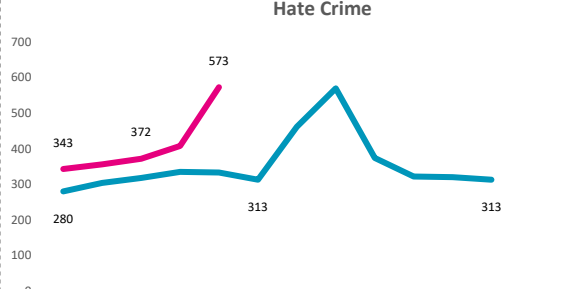

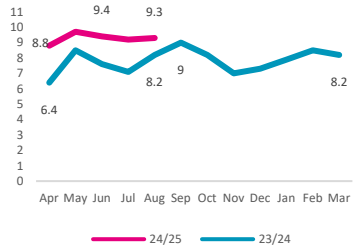

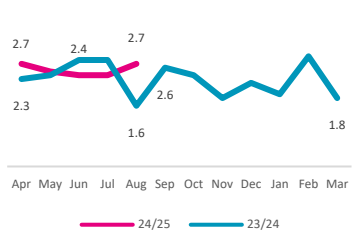
Disproportionality: Asian

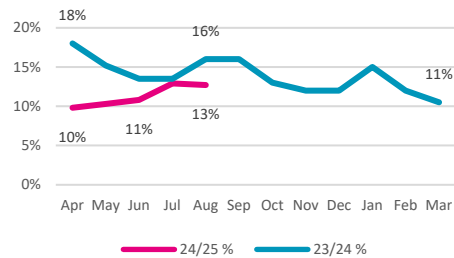

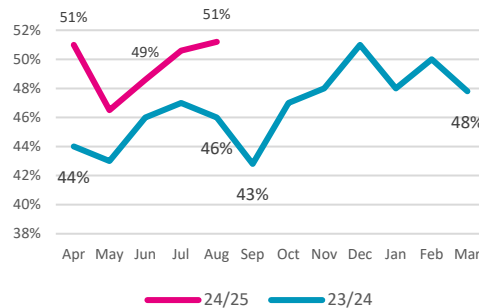
Overall find rate is **51%**

From all S&S conducted, **SDE was Not Stated 13%**, a 3%-point drop from 23/24 in the right direction.

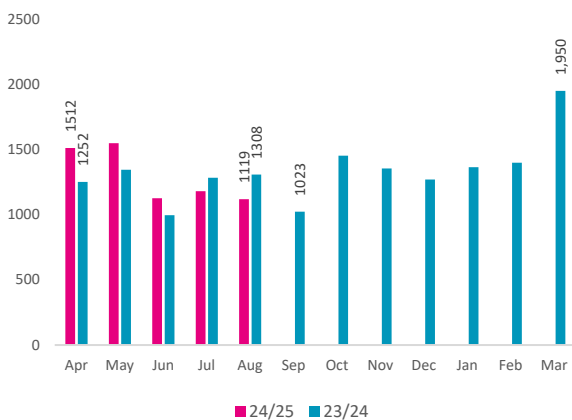
SDE "Not Stated" %



Find Rate %

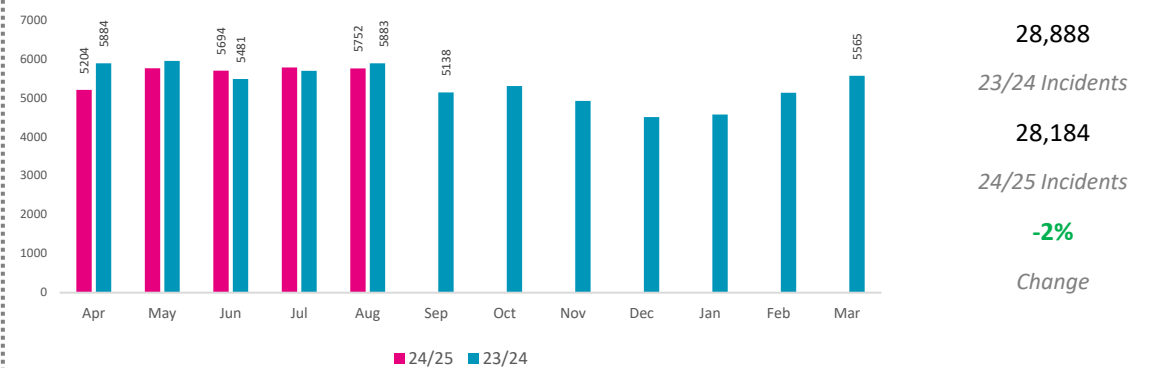


No of Stop and Searches



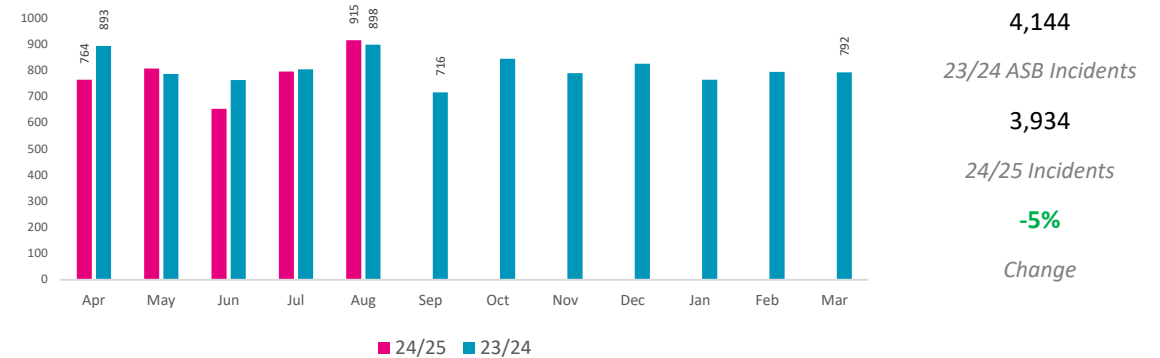

Forcewide Immediate & Priority ASB Incident Count

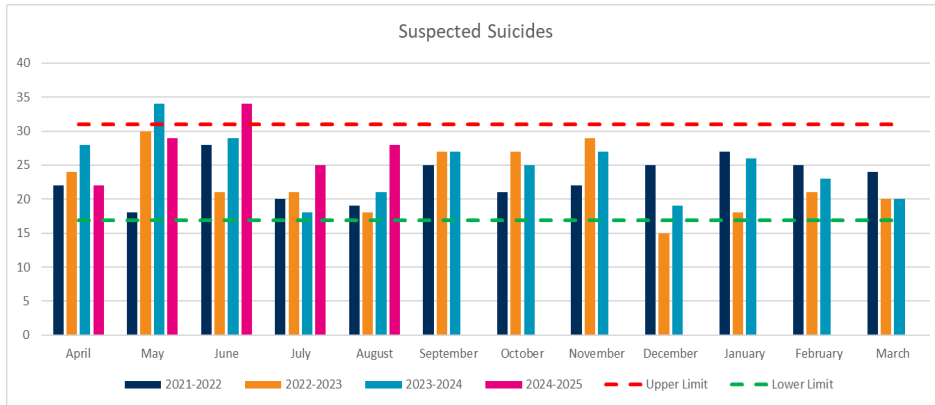

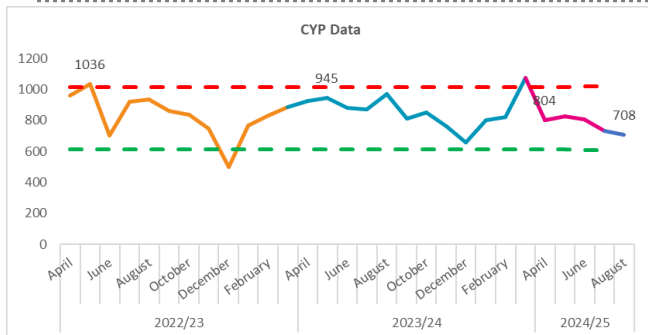
Suspected Suicides



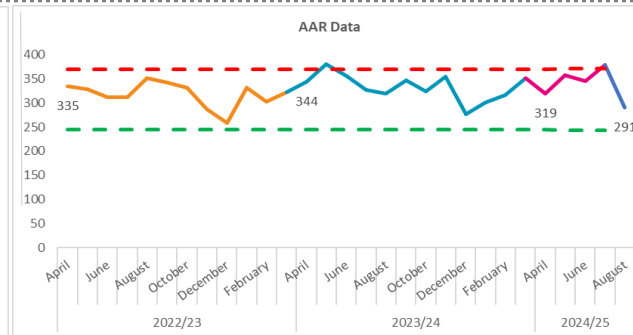
In August we recorded 28 suspected suicides. This is a +12% MoM increase, YTD average is currently higher than PYTD average (YTD 28.2; PYTD 26)

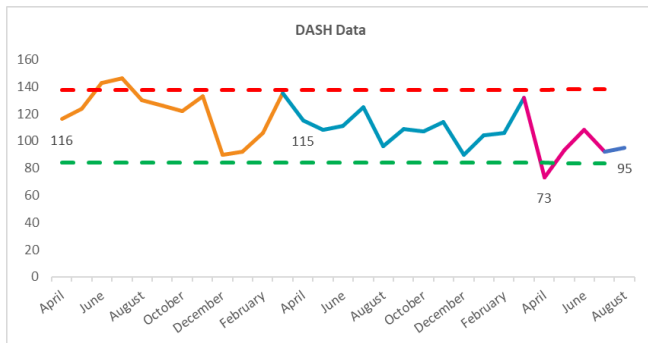

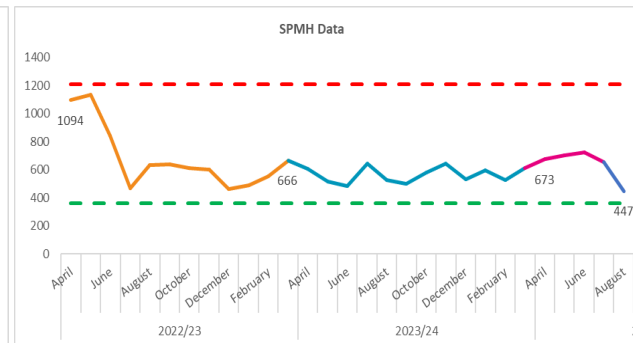

Non-suspicious Handback Times April 2023 - August 2024

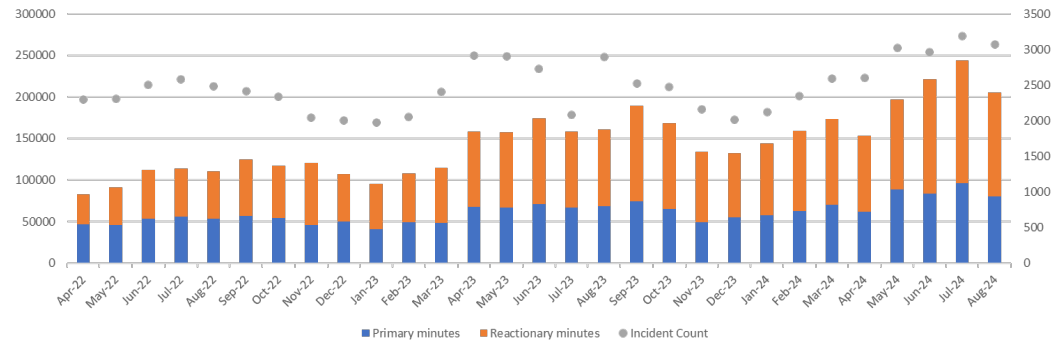

Reactionary minutes, which have been in an upward trend since the start of the FY, dropped in August by 15% from July; Incident count also dropped 4% from July; Primary minutes dropped 16% from July.

Overall notifiable offences

BTP recorded 8% more crime between 1 April and 31 August 2024 than the same period last year, to 35,278 offences. The largest driver of this increase continues to be theft of passenger property (+12% to 10,100). The Force solved 4% more crimes compared to last year, however the percentage solved rate reduced slightly from 12% to 11%.

Robbery

Robbery saw a 9% reduction compared to the same period last year, to 680 offences. There was a 21% increase from July to August, however the downward trend seen in previous months has seen offences down from 249 in January 2024 to 141 in August. The Force solved five fewer crimes (to 82) between April and August compared to the same period last year, however the solved rate increased slightly to 12%.

Sexual offences

The increased reporting of sexual offences to BTP was highlighted at the Finance, Legitimacy and Performance Committee in August. It was noted that whereas to date the Force had welcomed this as demonstrating increased confidence in reporting, there was caution around relying on this reasoning in the longer term. BTP recorded 19% more sexual offences between April and August compared to the same period last year, to 1,236 offences. The Force solved 19 more crimes (to 180) during the year to date, with the solved rate reduced from 16% to 15%.

Hate Crime

BTP recorded 31% more hate crimes during the year to date compared to the same period last year, to 2,052. There was a 13% increase from July to August, to 573. Over three quarters of offences are public order related, with most of these being racially aggravated harassment. As noted on page one of the Policing Plan update, 19% of offences in August were against rail staff. For the year to date this stood at 24%.

Police related disruption

Trespass continues to cause the most primary delay, accounting for 54% of overall primary delay minutes for the year to date. Trespass incidents have seen a 5% increase for the year to date, with primary disruption up by 26% (overall trespass delay saw a 34% increase). Overall police relation disruption incidents were up by 5% with primary delay up by 20% (overall police related delay minutes were up by 24%).
